

Modulanner

User Guide

A modular, hyperlinked planner that lives in a single notebook. Tap a button on your template and Modulanner finds the right dated page (creating it if needed) and links you to it. This guide covers every feature, plus a few known limits worth knowing.

Use the sections you need -- nothing here is required to start planning.

Installing Modulanner

Everything Modulanner uses lives in one folder you copy onto your device.

- 1

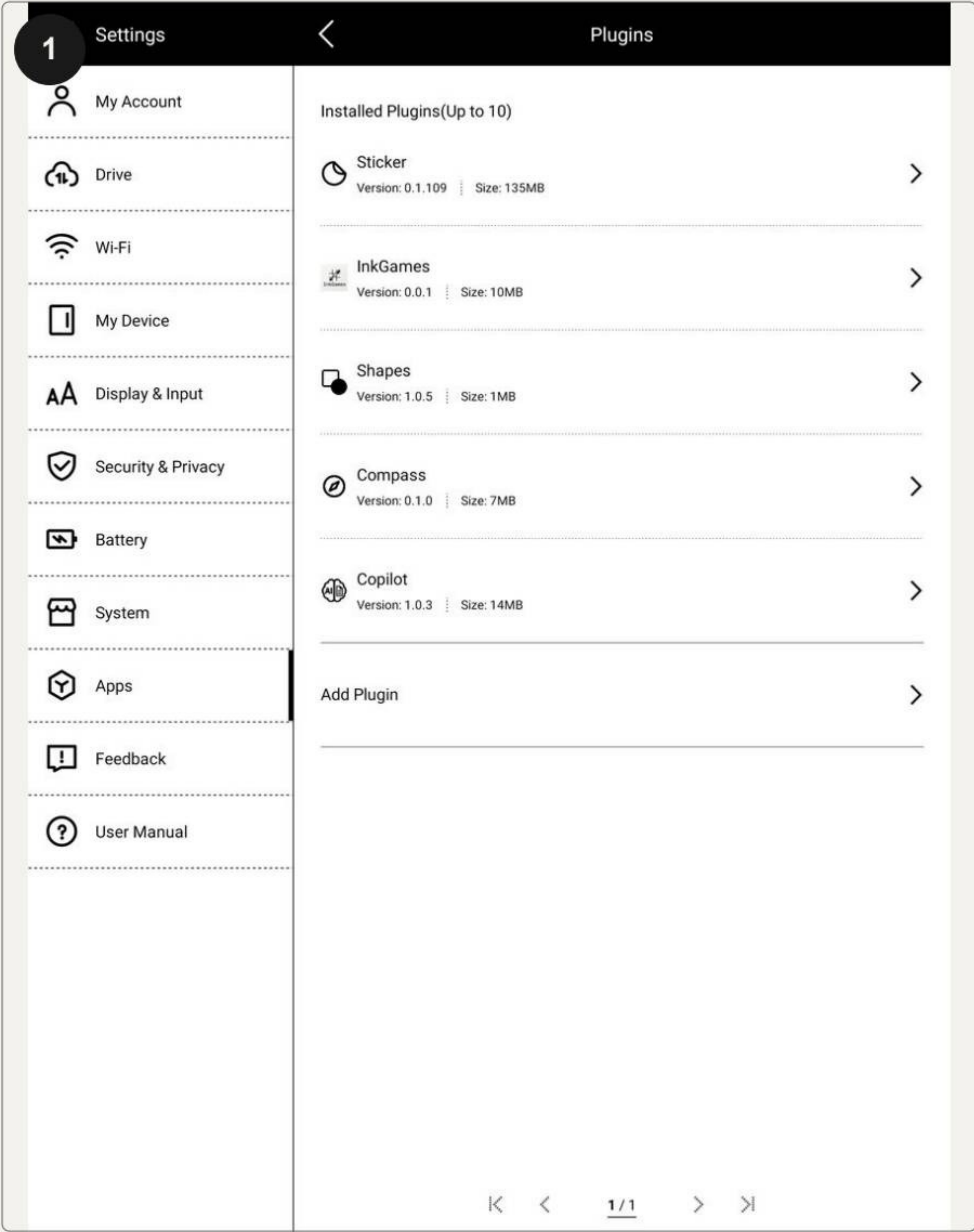
Unzip the download -- you get a folder named "Modulanner".
- 2

Copy that whole folder into your device's MyStyle folder, so you have MyStyle/Modulanner/ (use a USB cable, Supernote Partner, or a cloud drive to get it there).
- 3

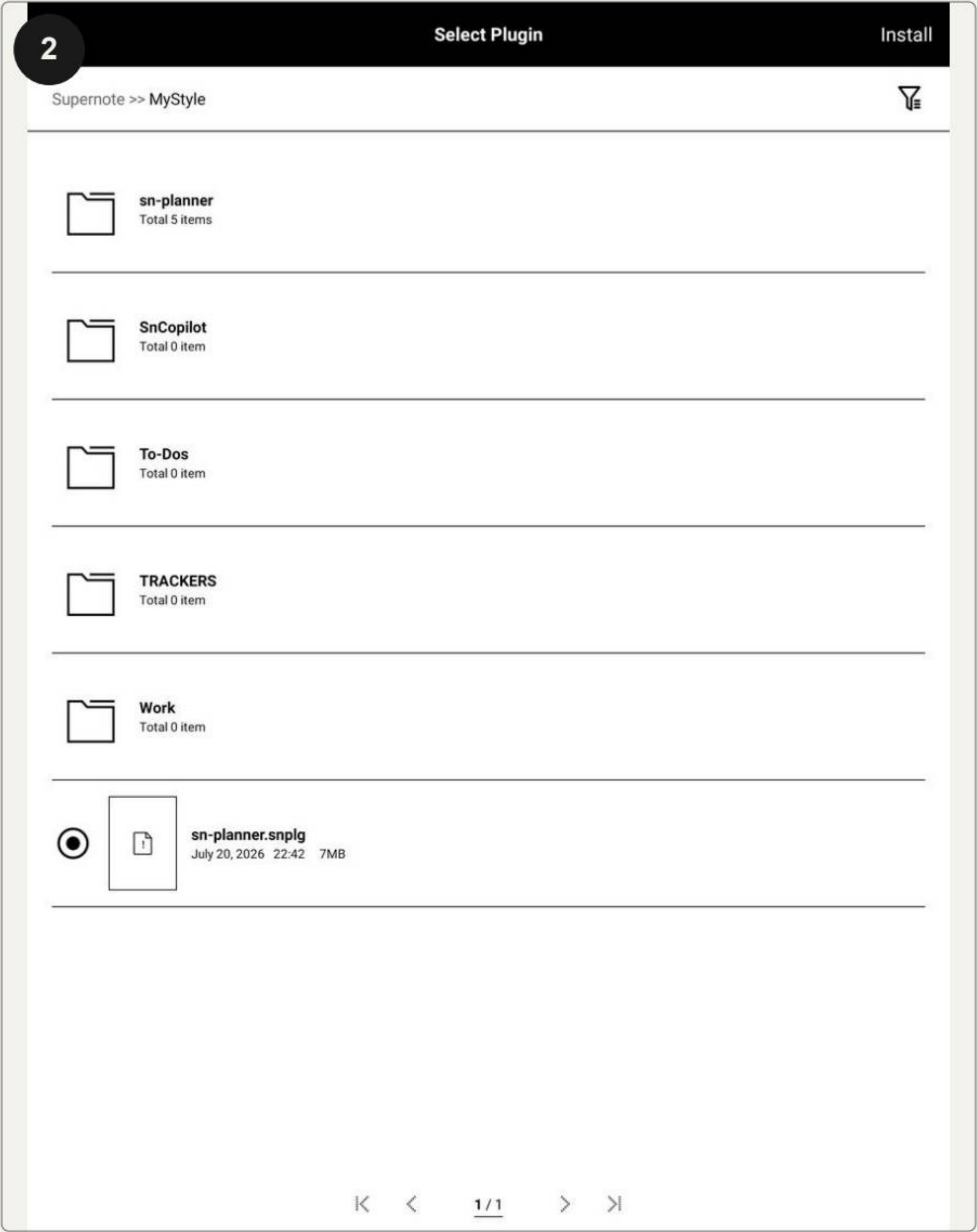
On the Supernote: Settings -> Apps (or Plugins) -> Add/Install plugin -> browse to MyStyle/Modulanner/Modulanner.snplg and install.

Free light version vs. full

The light version works right away with no key -- the core buttons (Today, Tomorrow, This/Next Week, This/Next Month) are free. Enter a key in Settings -> License to unlock everything else.

How your planner works

Your whole planner lives in one notebook. Pages aren't all made up front -- they're created the moment you need them and tagged with their date, so the plugin can always find them again.

Tapping a button

Tap an icon on your template: Modulanner finds the right page (creating it if it doesn't exist yet) and drops a link to it right on the page. Tap that link to jump there.

The link keeps itself current

That link is self-updating -- every tap re-points it to the correct page, so it never goes stale as your planner grows. For a page that already exists a new link is generated; for a brand-new page it's tap, then tap the link. A future update will make it a single direct tap.

What each button does

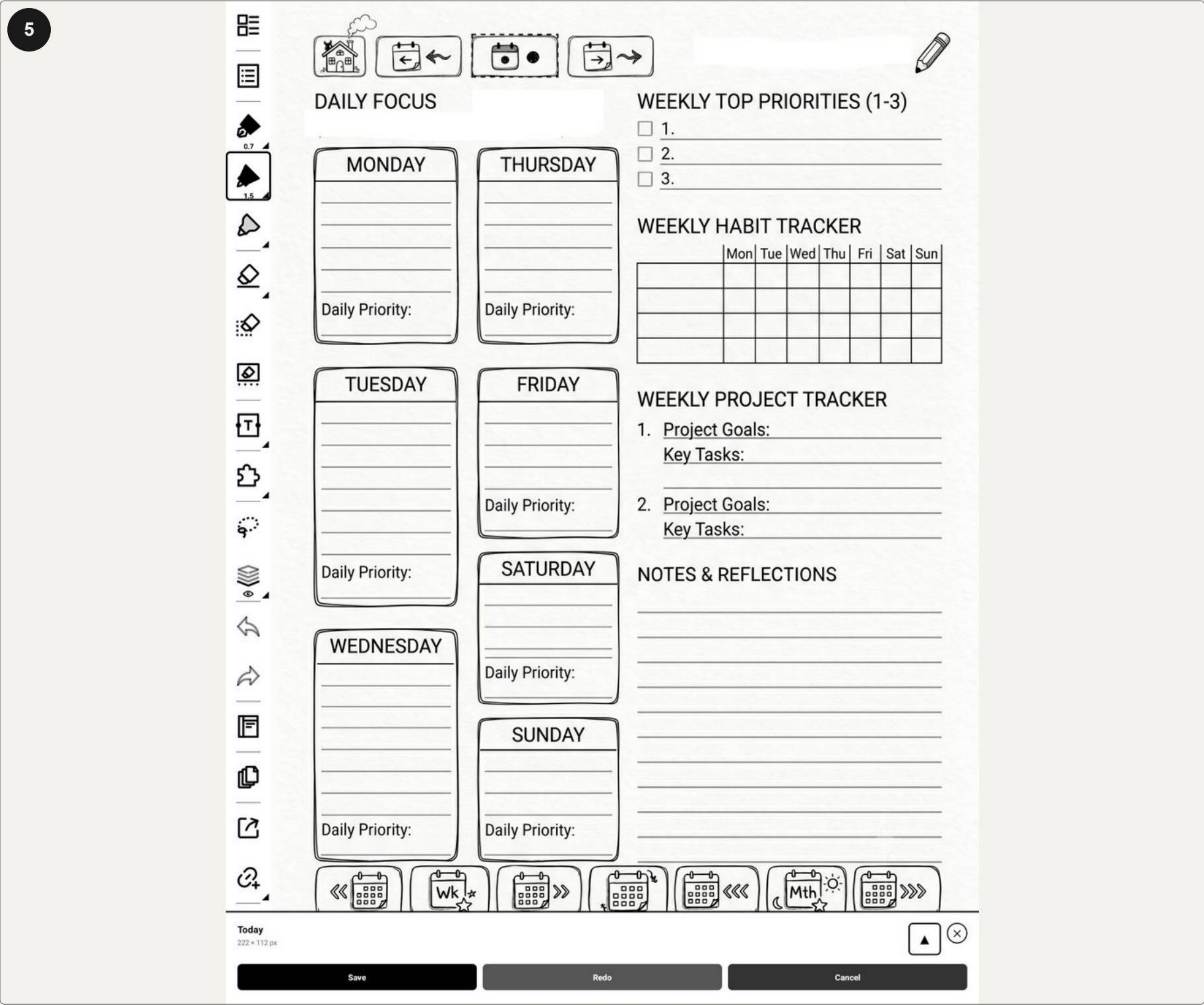
Every template has the same set of navigation buttons. Six are free; the rest need the full version (marked * below).

Free (light version)

Today, Tomorrow, This Week, Next Week, This Month, Next Month -- these work with no key.

Full version (*)

Yesterday *, Last Week *, Last Month *, Home *, and the Date Picker *, plus unlimited custom buttons. Unlock once in Settings -- it's offline, no internet needed.

The Date Picker

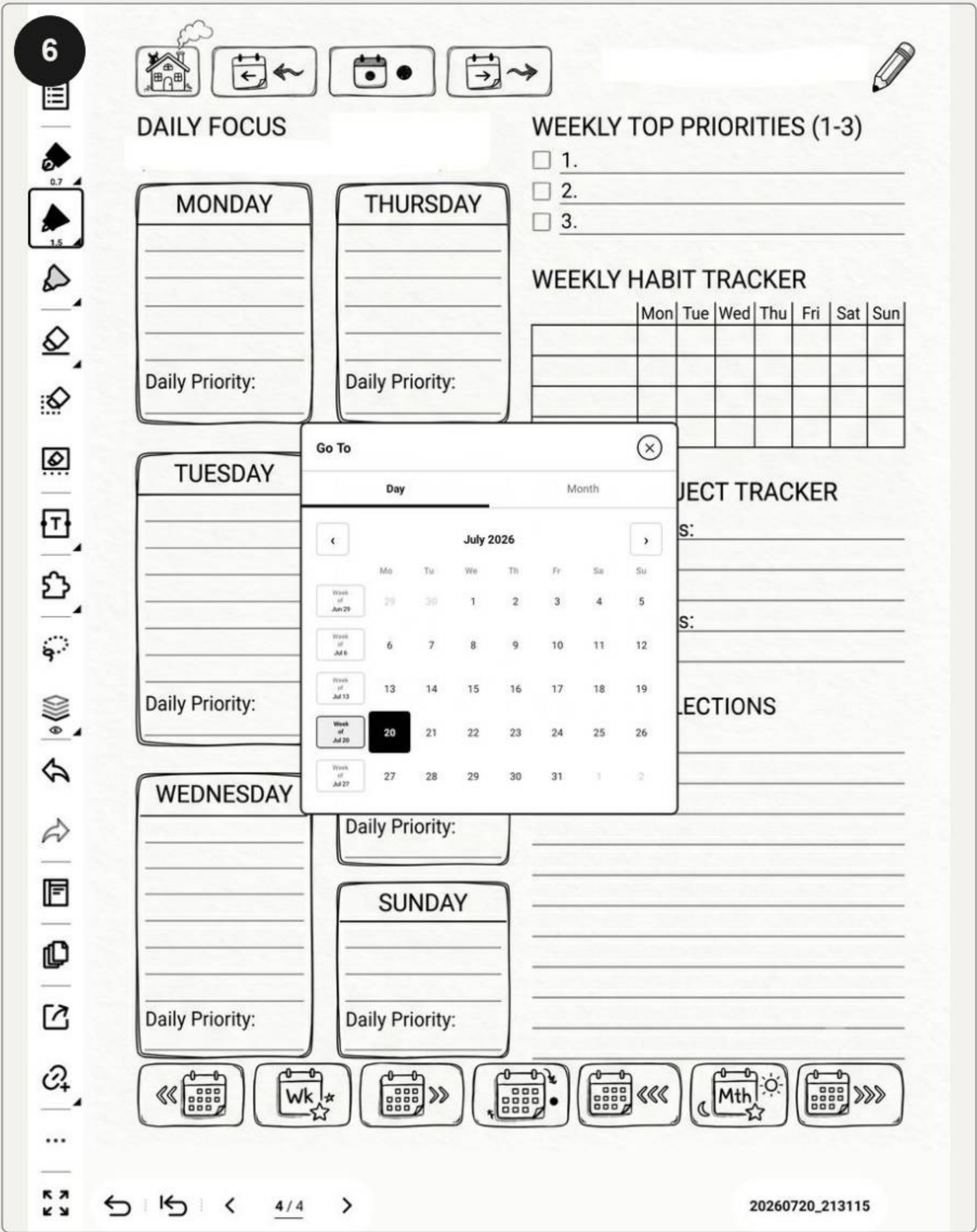
Instead of stepping through Yesterday, Last Week and so on one at a time, the Date Picker opens a calendar so you can jump straight to any day, week, or month.

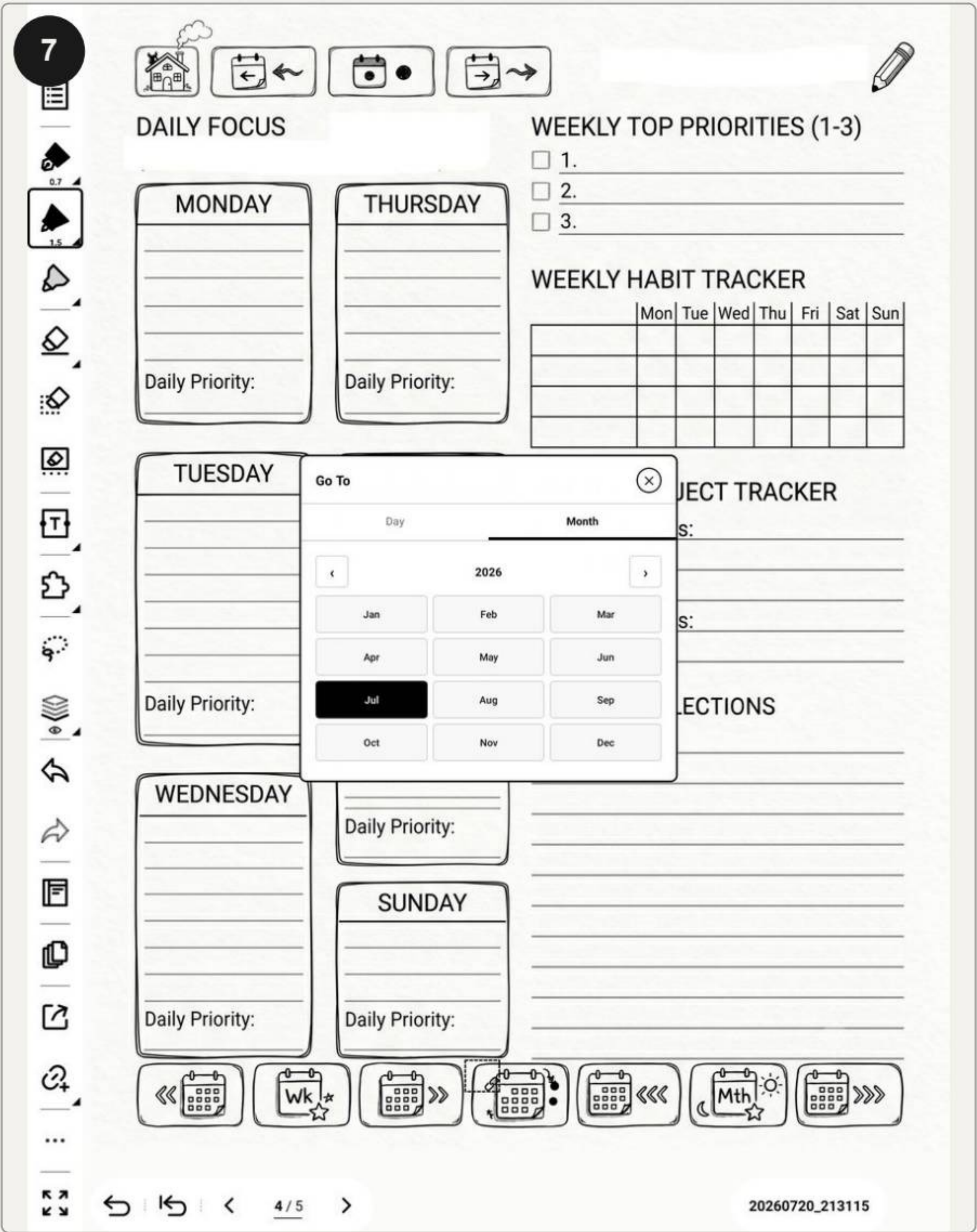
Tap the Date Picker icon (bottom row, once unlocked).
- 2

A calendar opens -- scroll to any day, week, or month.
- 3

Tap a date: Modulanner finds or creates that page and links to it, same as any other button.



Date Picker tapped -> calendar opens

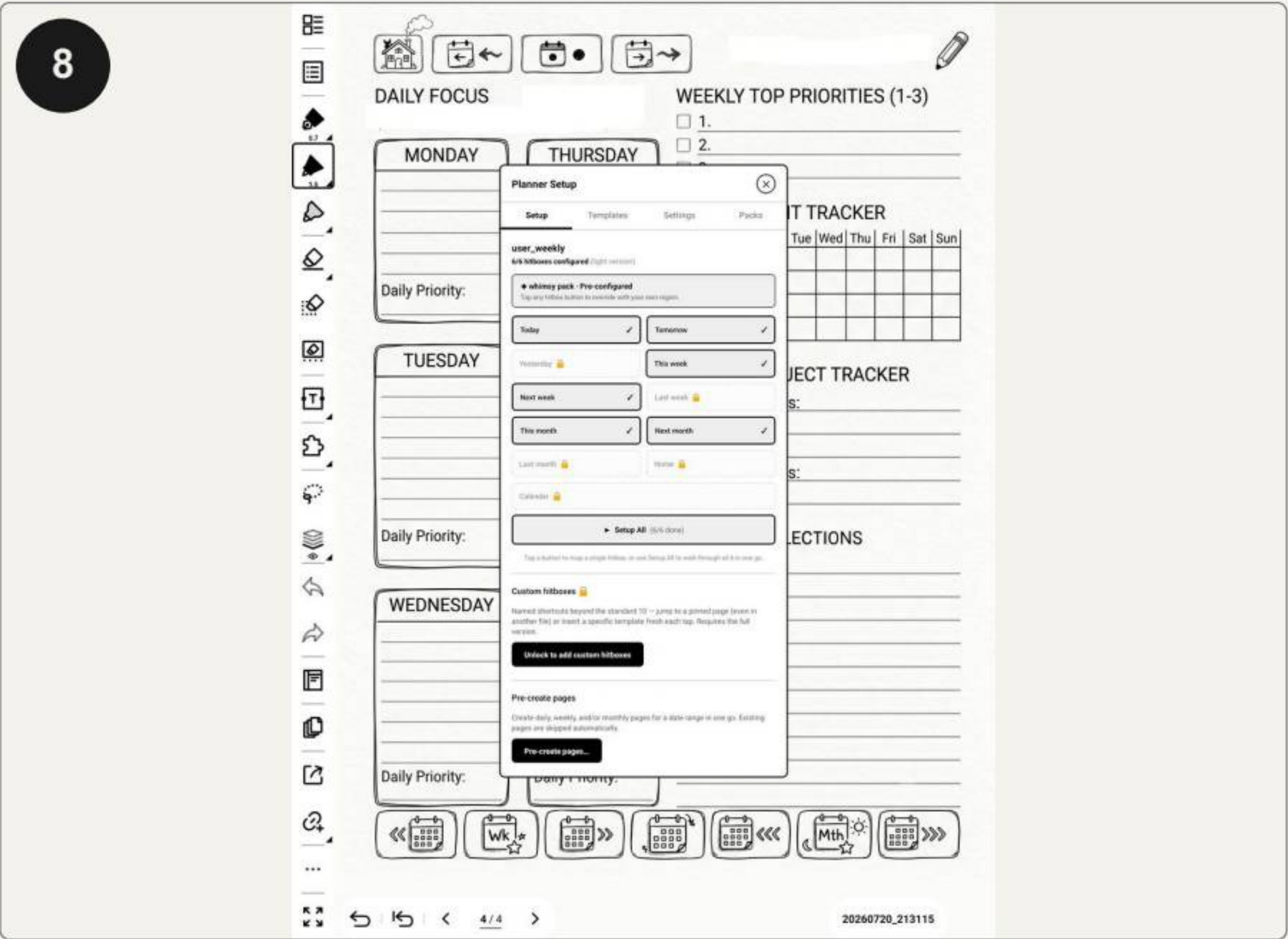


Calendar picker: day + month view

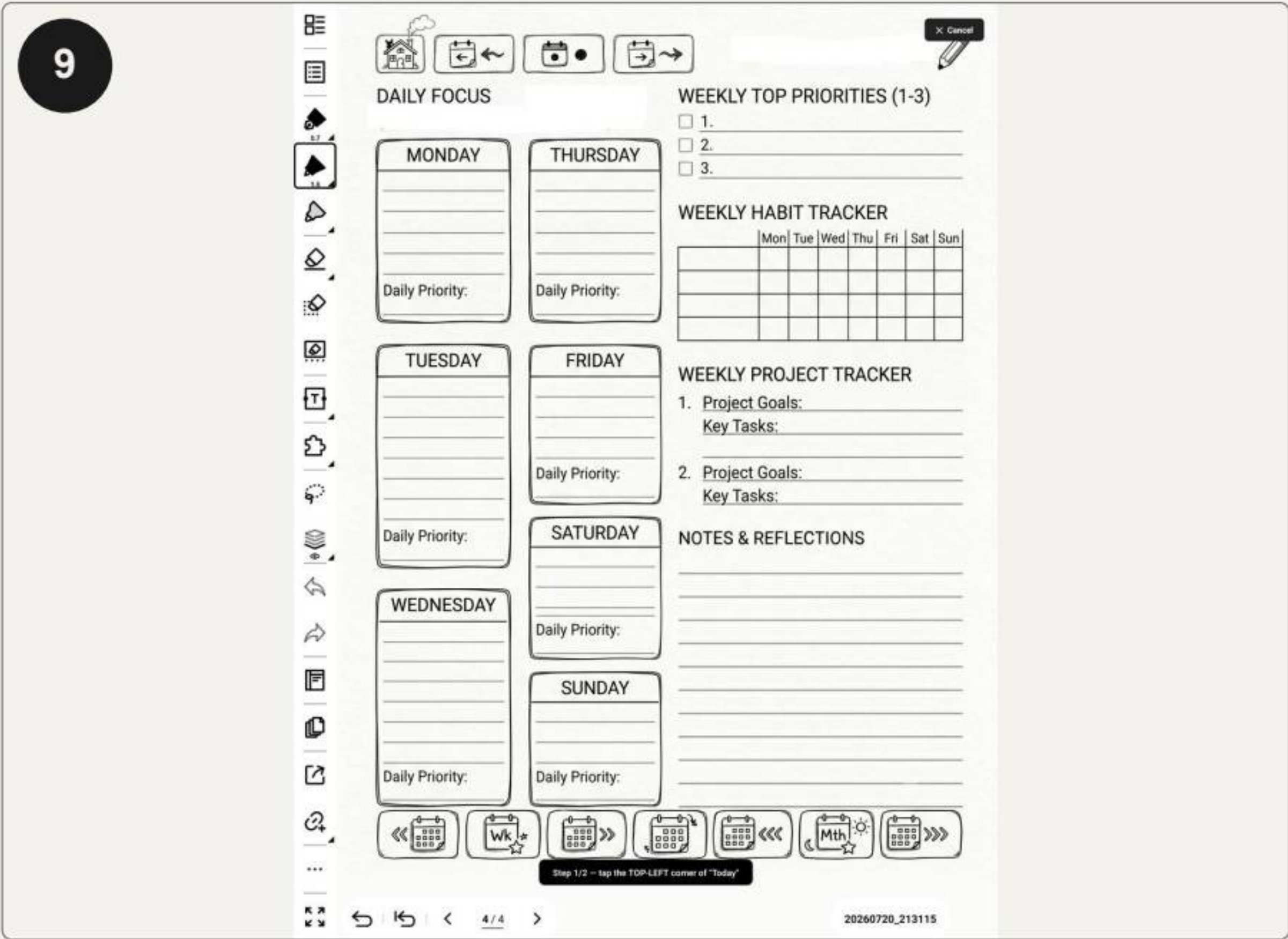
Setting up your own template

A button is a "hitbox": an invisible tap zone over an icon on your template. Packs come with these already placed -- you only set them up yourself when you build your own template.

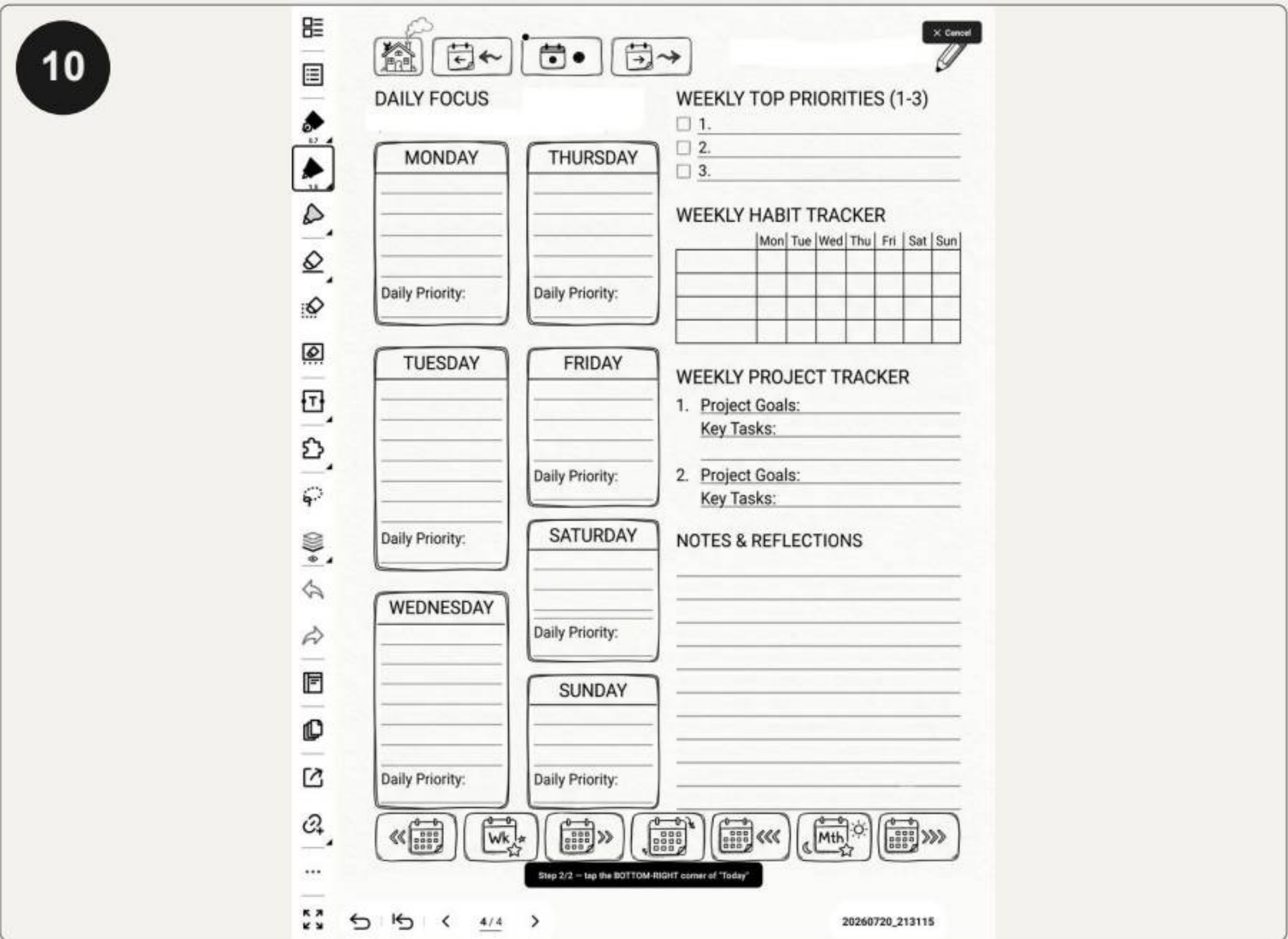
- 1

- Open the plugin panel -> Setup tab.
- Tap the button you want to place (e.g. "Today").
- Tap the icon's top-left corner, then its bottom-right corner.
- Confirm the preview, or Redo if it's off.



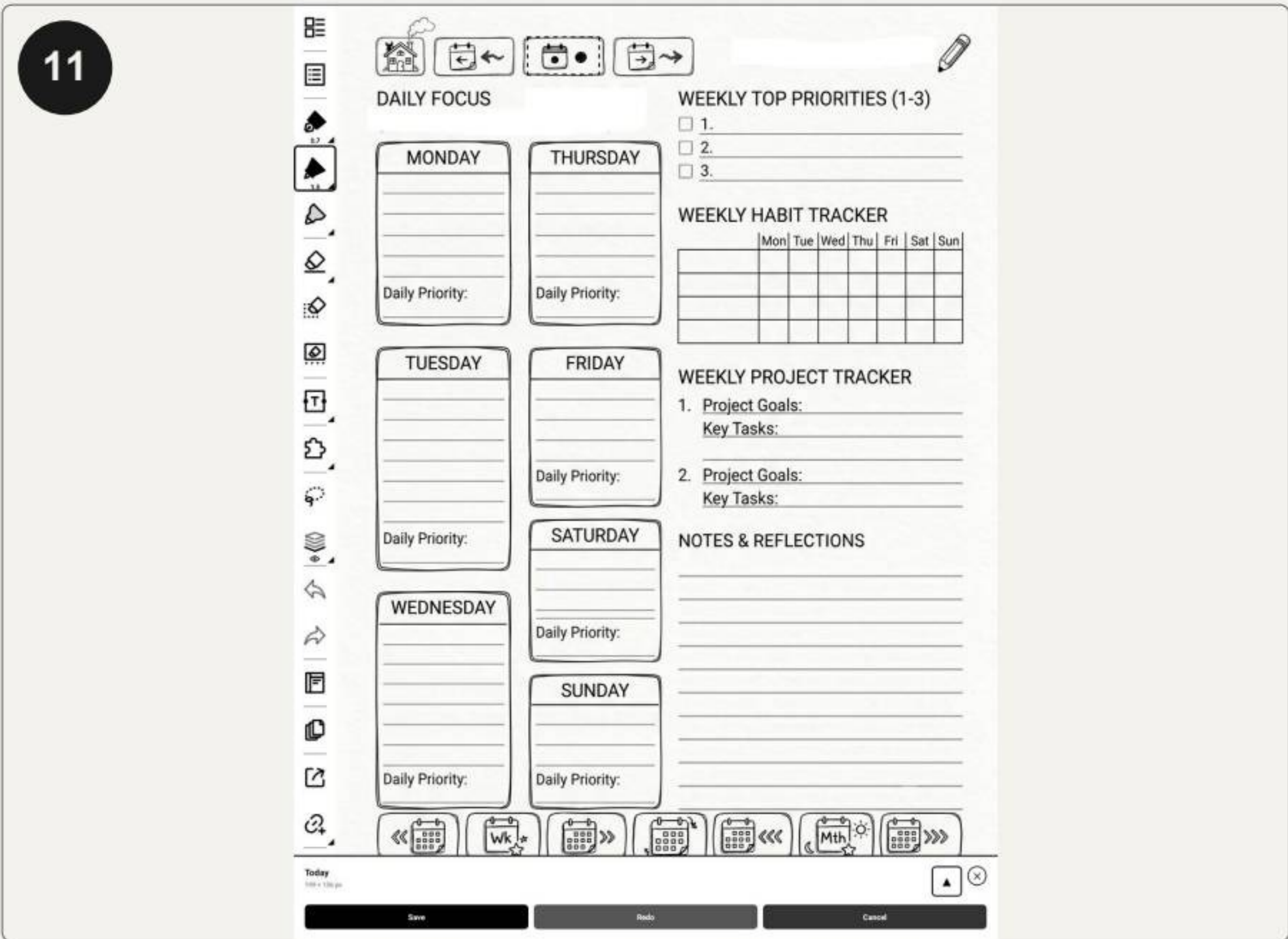
Setup tab: the button list

Confirm: preview box + Save / Redo

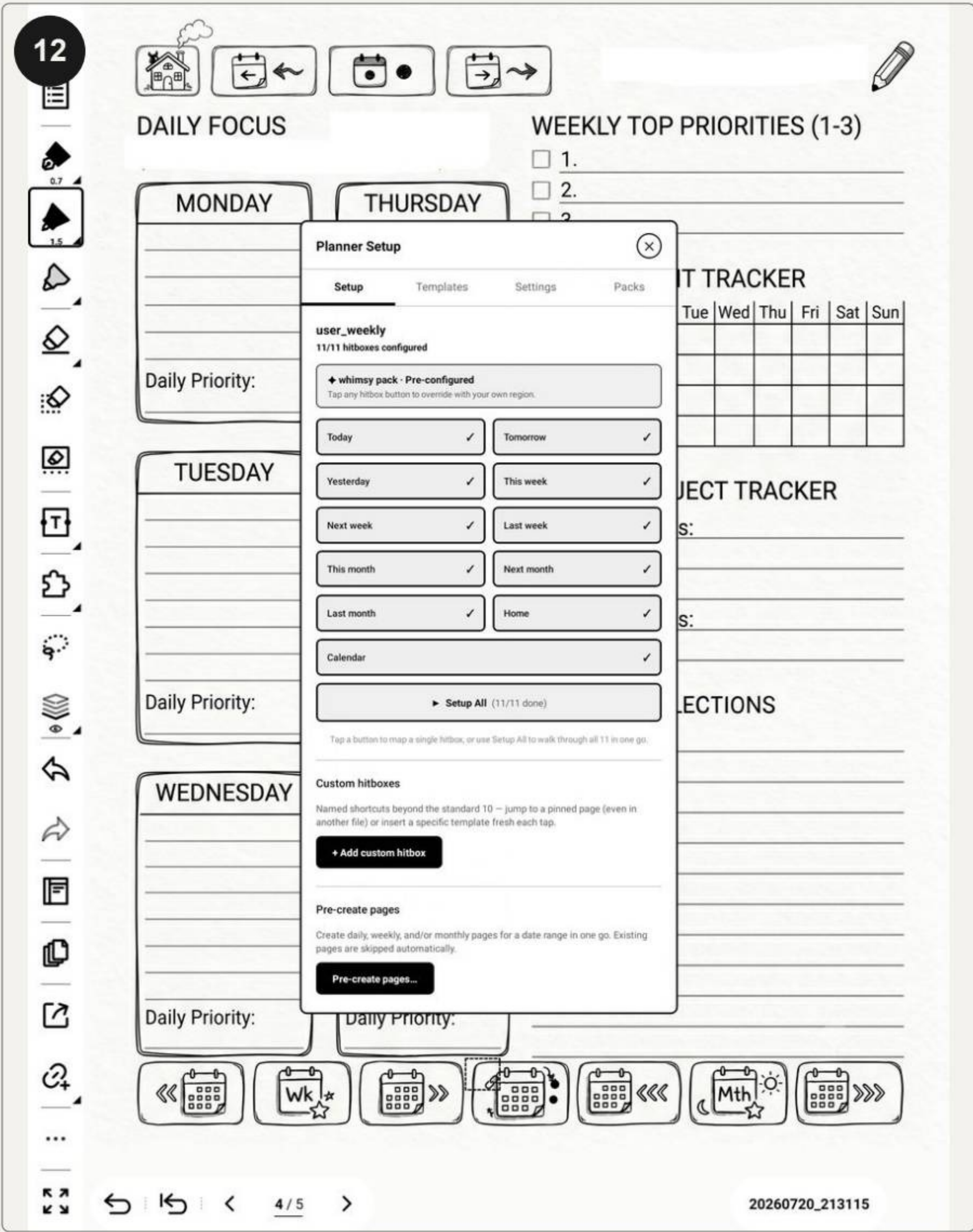
Set up a whole template at once

Building your own template? Setup All walks you through every button in order instead of one at a time.

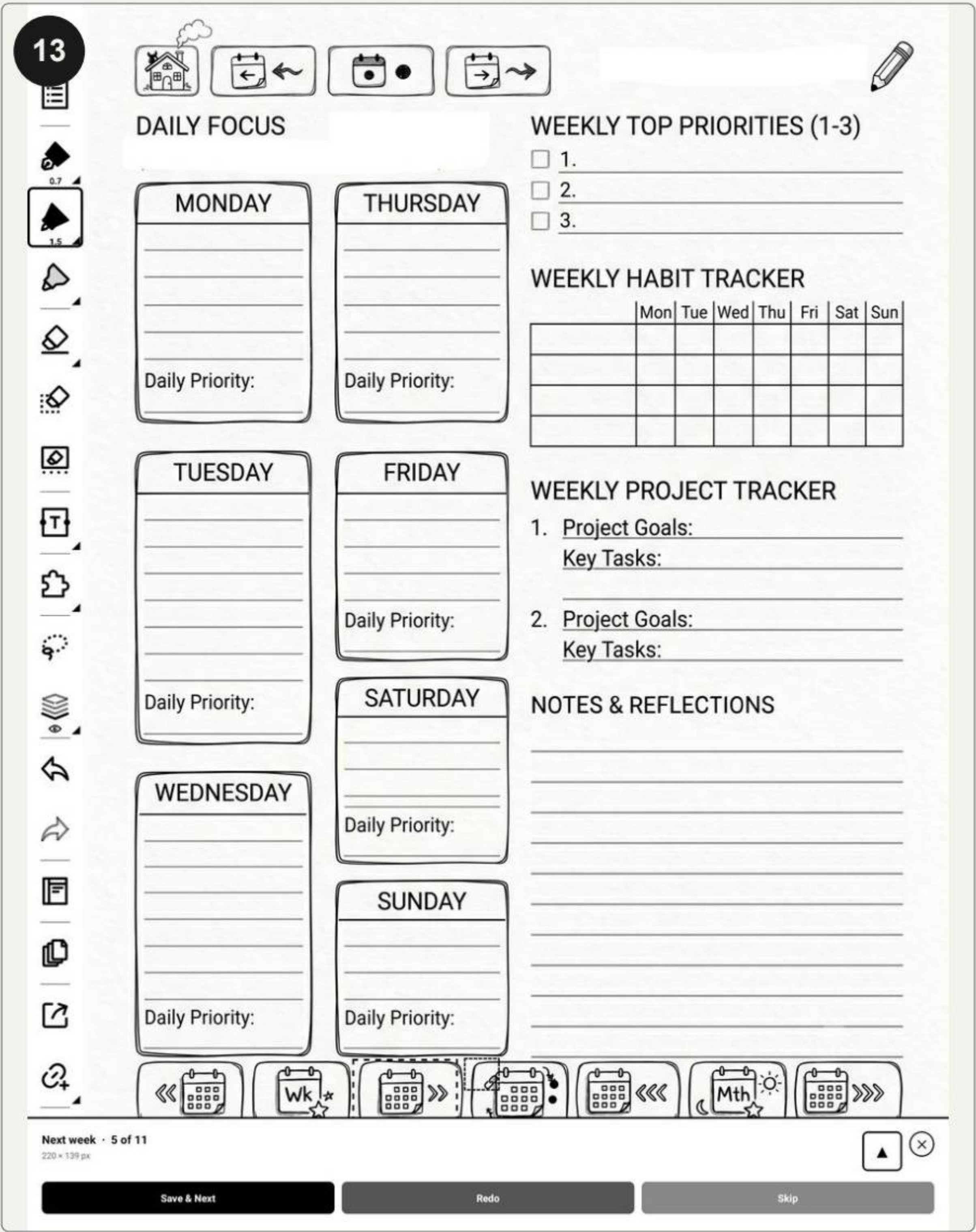
- 1
 Setup tab -> Setup All.
- 2
 It highlights each button in turn -- draw its two corners, then Save & Next.
- 3
 Skip any you don't want. The counter shows your progress.

Light version note

Setup All only walks through the free buttons until you unlock -- the locked ones are skipped automatically.

Themes & template packs

Your planner's look -- and its ready-made buttons -- come from a template pack. The included Whimsy set is one; you can install others.

- 1

Copy a pack folder into /MyStyle/Modulanner/packs/<Name>/ on your device.
- 2

In the plugin, open the Packs tab and tap Scan for packs.
- 3

Open the Templates tab and pick a template from the pack.

Works on both devices

A pack records the resolution it was drawn at; Modulanner automatically scales its buttons to fit whichever device you're on (Manta or Nomad), so one pack works on both.

Make your own buttons

Beyond the built-in navigation buttons, add your own named buttons to any template -- as many as you like.

Two kinds

Go to a page: jumps to one specific page you pick, even in a different notebook or a PDF.
Insert a template: drops a fresh page from a template you choose, every tap (e.g. a "New Recipe" button).

How to add one

Setup tab -> Custom buttons -> Add. Name it, choose what it does, then draw its two corners.
For "go to a page", first make a link with NOTE's own Insert Link on that page, then come back and tap Capture.

Automatic date labels

New pages can stamp their own date on them -- "Mon May 18, 2026" and so on -- so every page is labeled without you writing it.

- 1

Settings -> turn on Page labels.
- 2

Pick the format, size, and style.
- 3

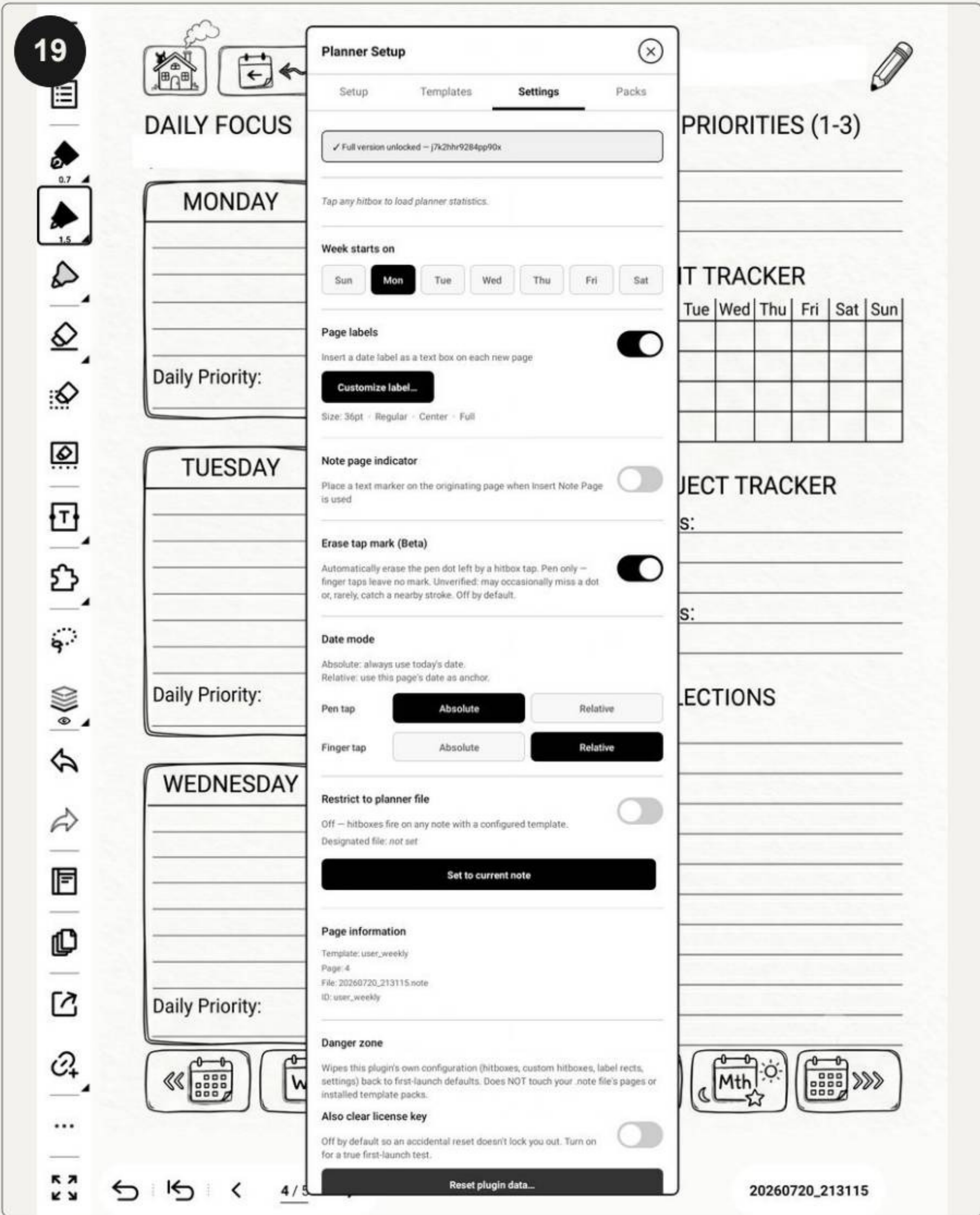
Draw the label area on your template once, in Setup.

If a label doesn't appear right away

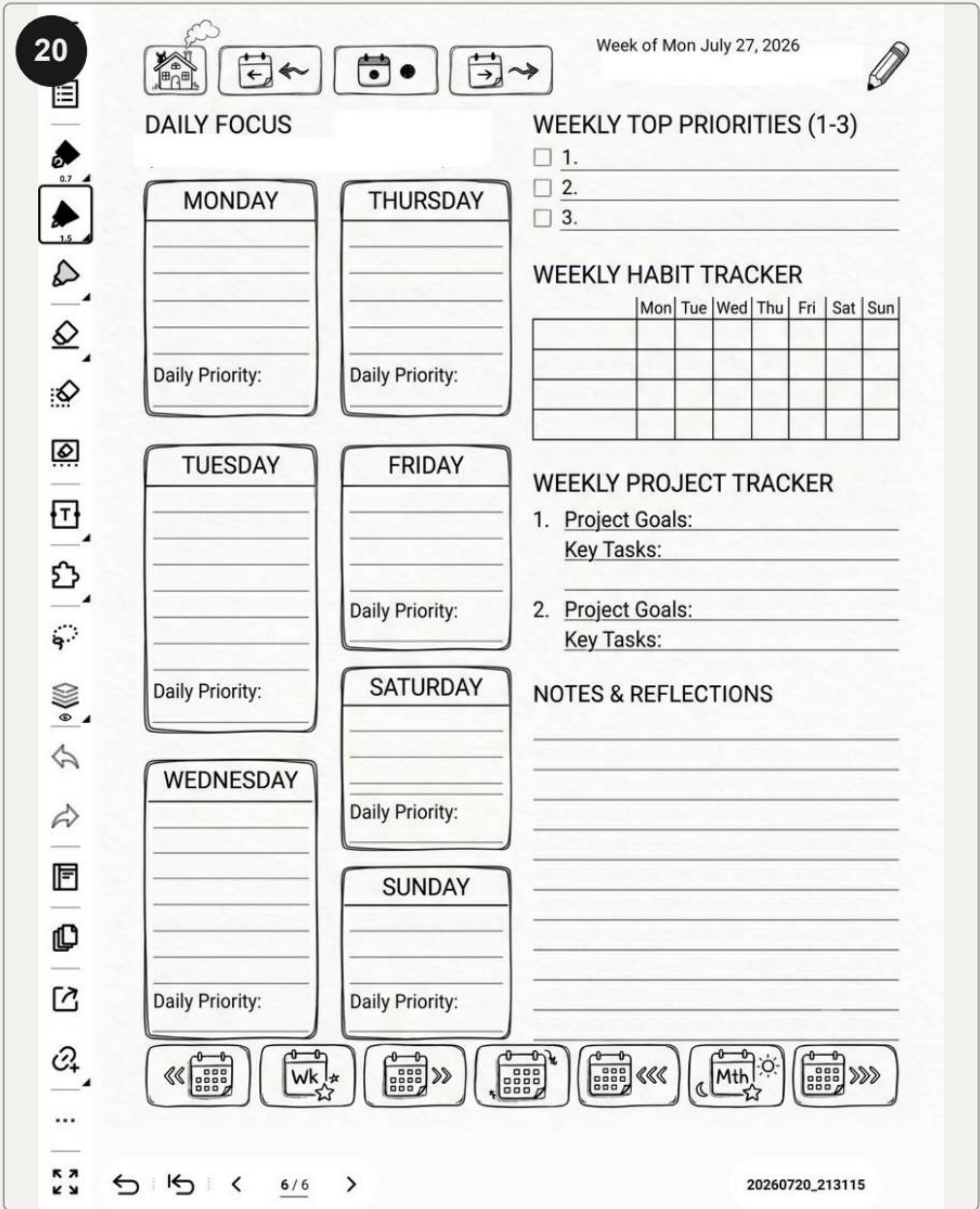
A label added by a finger tap (or the button below) may not show until you refresh the page -- refresh it with a swipe up on the right sidebar. A pen tap usually shows it immediately.

Label this page now

Under Settings -> Page labels there's a "Label this page now" button that adds a date label to the page you're currently on -- handy if a label got erased by accident.

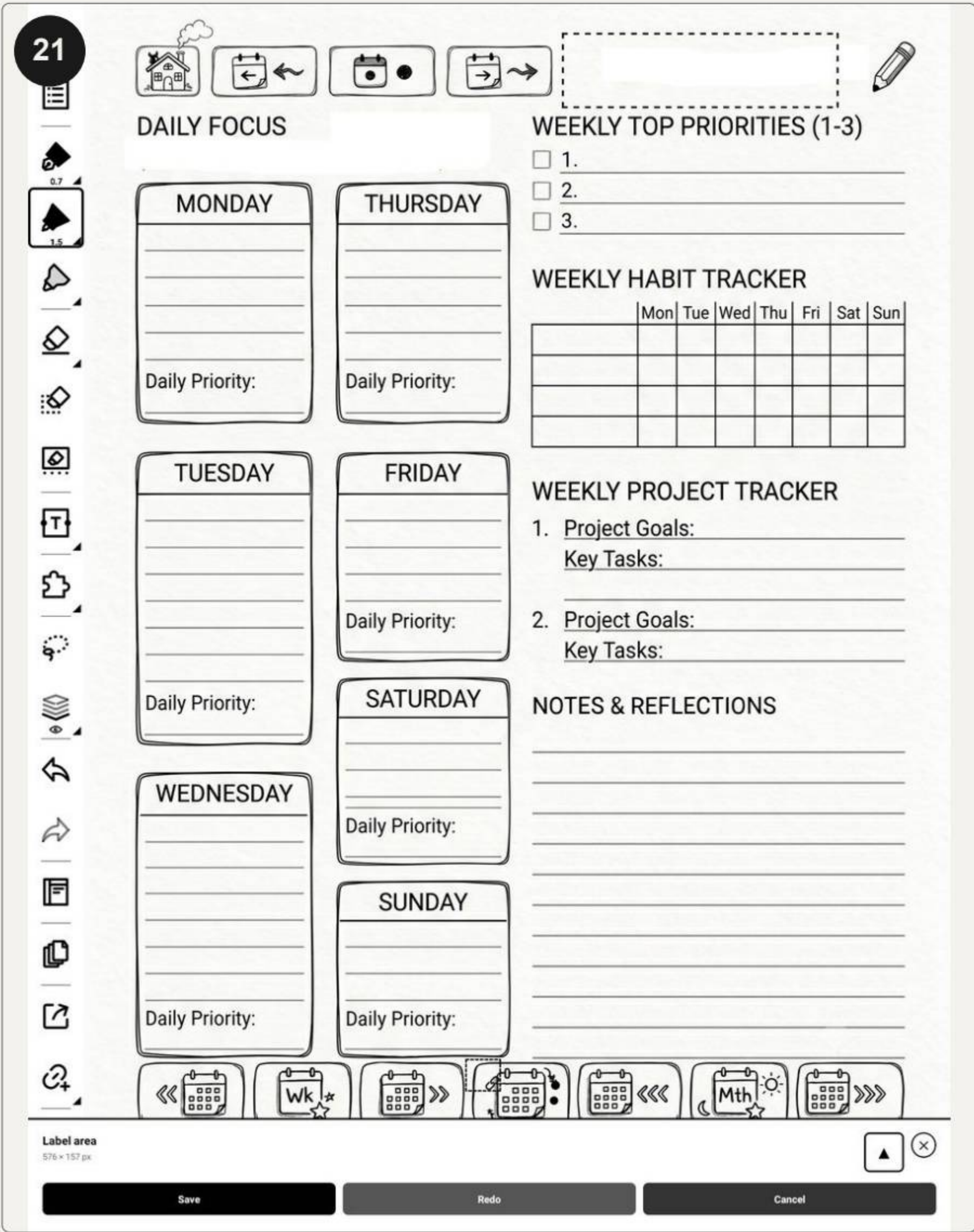
Customize your date label

Beyond the built-in Full / Short / Numeric formats, build your own from tappable tokens -- a different pattern for daily, weekly, and monthly pages.

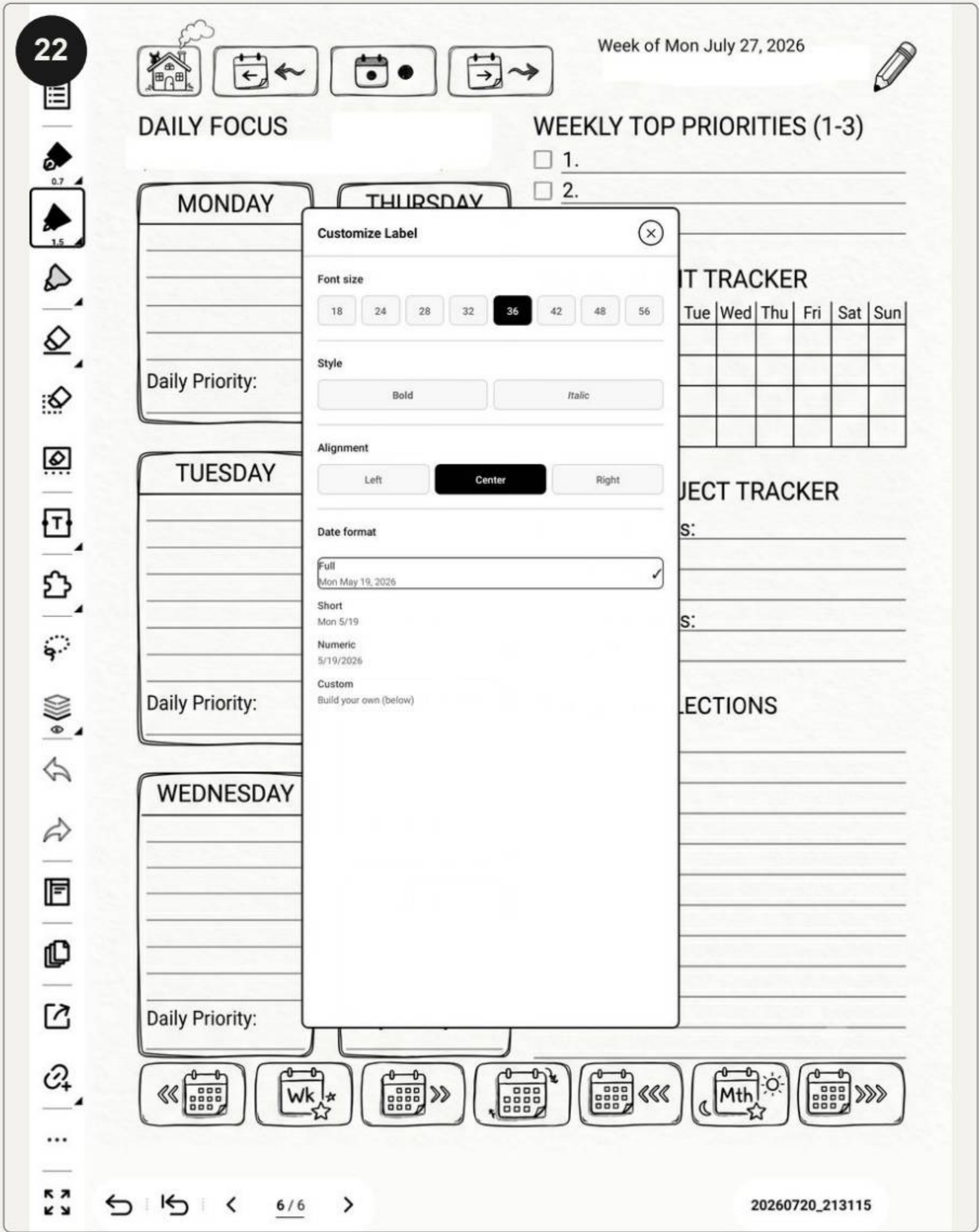

- Setup tab -> place the label area on the page.
- Settings -> Customize label -> pick Font size, Style, and Alignment.
- Pick "Custom" under Date format, then tap tokens to build a pattern (or type one) -- a live preview updates as you go.

Weekly ranges

Weekly patterns can reference the END of the week too (for ranges like "Jul 20 - Jul 26") -- a separate row of "End" tokens appears only for the Weekly pattern.

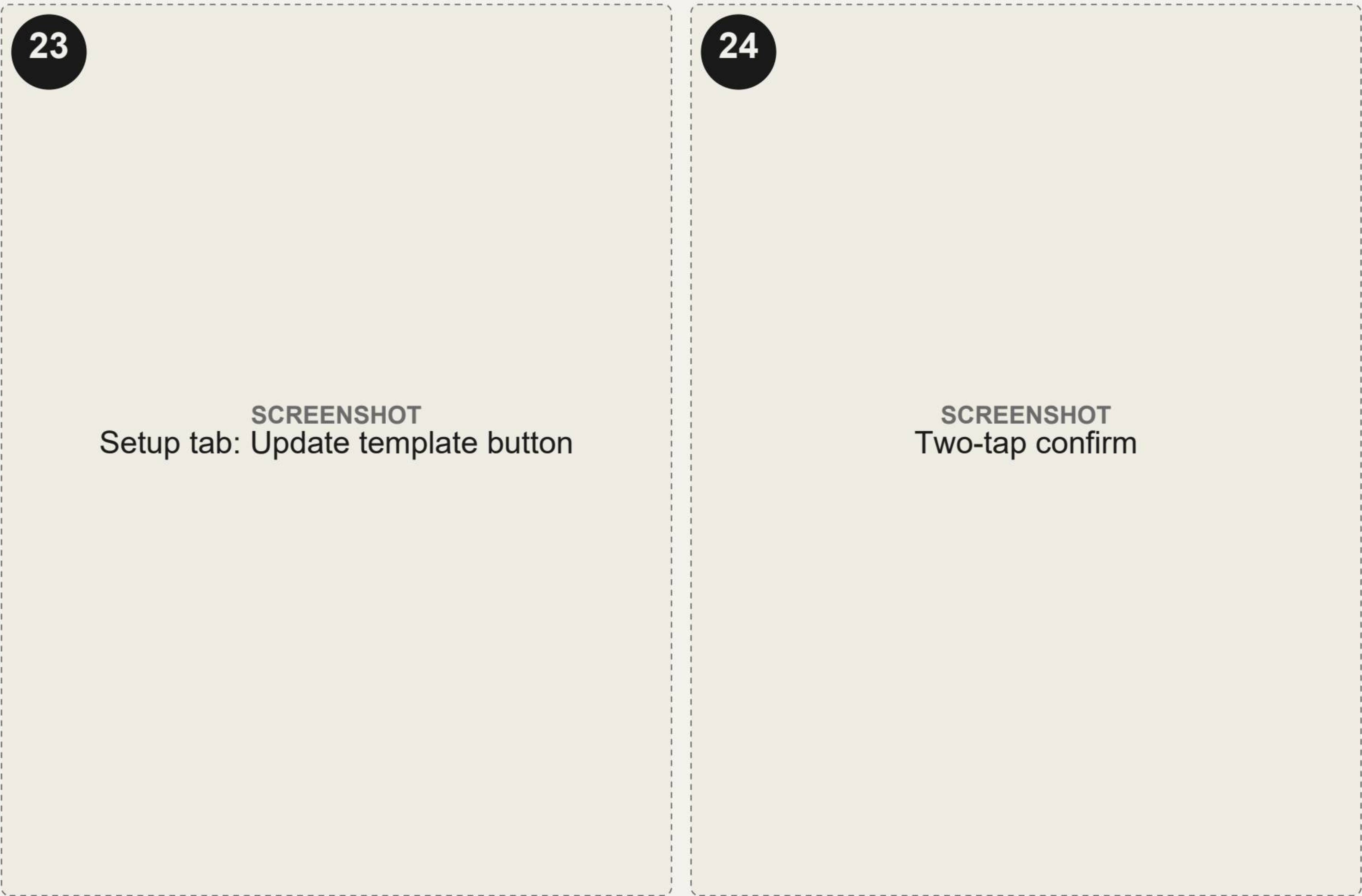
Bake a sticker into a template

Drew a new icon or added a sticker to a page and want it on every future page from that template? Update the template from the page.

- 1 On a page made from the template, draw or add whatever you want baked in.
- 2 Open the plugin -> Setup tab -> "Update template with this page".
- 3 Tap again to confirm. New pages from that template now include your change.

Works for any template you're using

Available for any template within your Modulanner folder -- your own daily/weekly/monthly/custom templates and pack templates alike. For a pack template, a note reminds you that reinstalling the pack later would overwrite the change.



Fill a date range at once

Rather than creating pages one tap at a time, pre-create a whole stretch.

- 1 Setup tab -> Pre-create pages.
- 2 Choose which kinds: daily, weekly, and/or monthly.
- 3 Pick a date range and start. Existing pages are skipped.

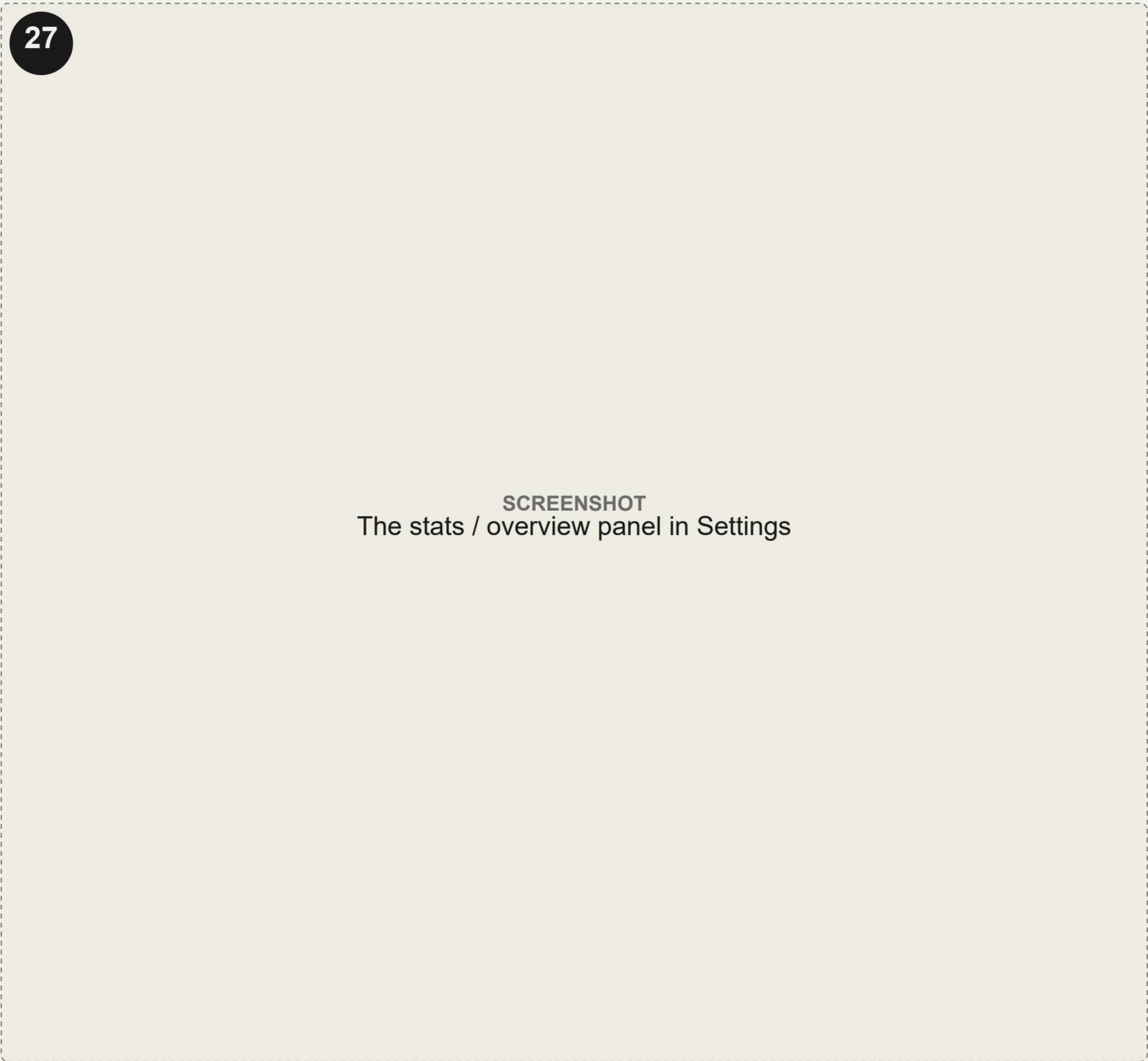
Result summary (created / skipped)

Your planner at a glance

The plugin keeps a running overview of what you've built -- and quietly flags anything odd.

What it shows

How many daily / weekly / monthly pages you have, the date range they cover, gaps in the sequence (a missing day or week), and any accidental duplicate pages. It refreshes each time you tap a button.



Settings worth knowing

A few options change how navigation behaves. Defaults are sensible -- reach for these only if you want to.

Date mode -- absolute vs relative

Absolute always uses today's real date. Relative works from the date of the page you're on. Pen and finger taps can each use a different mode.

Week start day

Choose which day weeks begin on -- it sets which day the weekly pages open to.

Keep it to one notebook

Turn on "restrict to planner file" and point it at this notebook, so buttons only react here and never fire in your other notes.



Unlocking everything

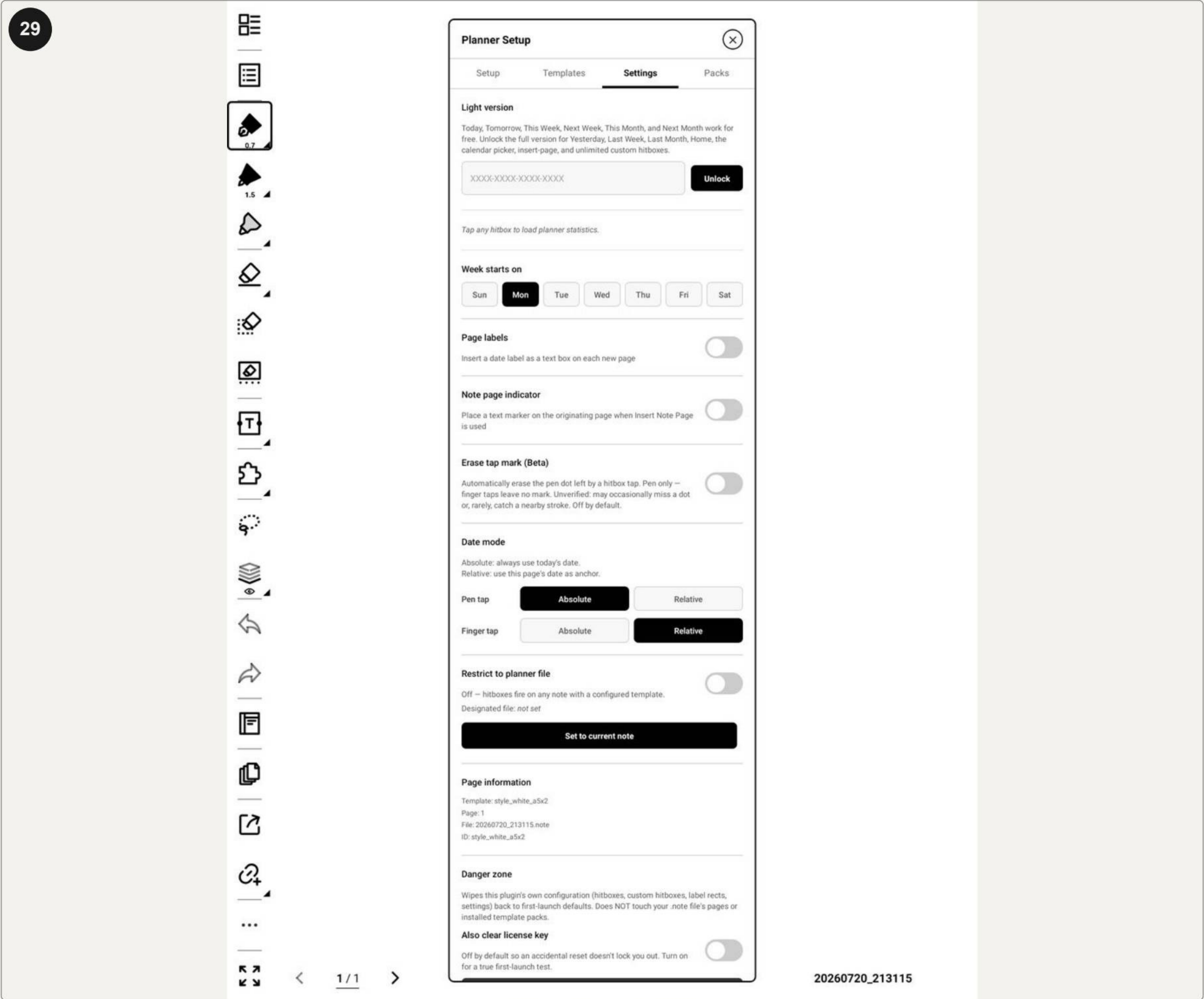
The light version is free and needs no key. Unlocking adds the rest of the buttons, the Date Picker, and unlimited custom buttons -- once, and fully offline.

- 1

Open the Settings tab and find the License field.
- 2

Type your key and tap Unlock.
- 3

That's it -- it stays unlocked, and re-entering the same key re-unlocks after a reinstall.

Found a bug? Capture logs

If something misbehaves, you can save a log of recent activity and send it to the developer -- it makes bugs far easier to track down.

- 1 Settings -> Diagnostics -> tap "Capture logs".
- 2 It saves a text file under MyStyle/Modulanner/logs/ and shows the path.
- 3 Send that file along with a note about what you were doing.



A few limitations

Nothing's broken -- these are just things worth knowing so nothing surprises you.

Use it in portrait

Buttons work in portrait (upright or upside-down). In landscape they're turned off -- rotate back to portrait to tap them.

A new label may refresh late

A date label added by a finger tap may not appear until you refresh the page -- refresh with a swipe up on the right sidebar. Pen taps usually show it right away.

Buttons stay active until you open a different file

A stray pen or finger tap can still trigger a button on other screens (the file browser, page overview) until you open a different notebook. A fix is waiting on a new hook from Supernote.

Erase tap mark is experimental

The optional auto-erase of the little tap dot works most of the time but can occasionally miss. It's off by default.

PDF Templates probably won't work
